- 5) Will the builder require you to pay extra for items that should be standard? A reputable builder will provide you with a detailed list of items and specifications that are included in your purchase before you make your decision.
- 6) Can the builder supply you with names and addresses of former customers for the last 28 years? Contractors who are proud of their work know their customers are pleased with the end results. Reputation and word-of-mouth recommendations can alert you to any potential problems.
- 7) Will people associated with the building industry...building inspectors, bankers, subcontractors consumer protection agencies, ect... speak highly of the integrity of the contractor? People in the know are good sources to attest to the stability of the builder.
- 8) Do you get a sense of helpfulness and friendliness from the contractor? You will have to have frequent contact with the company you choose. Will you be able to speak to the builder after you sign your contract or do you become a number?
- 9) Will the builder be able to accommodate any special features or housing needs you may have and be considerate of the monetary guidelines you offer? Planning a home is uniquely personal; you should have a true custom builder you feel comfortable with to discuss all aspects of this endeavor.
